Admission Policy

The undergraduate programs at TUFS offer a basic grounding in a range of academic disciplines related to the world's languages, cultures, and societies, as well as in fields offering an interdisciplinary perspective on diverse international problems and issues.

TUFS seeks students who have completed a comprehensive high school education in Japan or abroad, are able to think critically, make informed decisions, and express themselves articulately, have inquiring minds and a thirst for knowledge, share the University's mission, and are eager to work together with people of diverse cultural backgrounds to address global problems and issues.

The School of Japan Studies welcomes individuals seeking to study Japan from an international perspective, become global leaders with a deep understanding of Japanese language and culture, and contribute to the advancement of multilingual and multicultural societies in Japan and elsewhere.

Our graduates go on to work in global corporations, Japanese companies seeking to expand globally, municipal, national, and international organizations, interpreting and translation, tourism and transport, publishing, mass media, educational and research institutions involved in teaching Japanese language and culture, and as junior and senior high school Japanese language teachers. Students may also elect to continue their studies in graduate school and pursue careers in research.

■ Features

The School of Japan Studies offers the opportunity to study and discover Japan from a multi-disciplinary, international perspective. Each cohort is comprised of students from around the world. Entrants have the opportunity to learn and share ideas with students from a diverse array of linguistic and cultural backgrounds.

Intensive multi-lingual, intercultural exchange enables students to develop the innovative problem-solving skills required to succeed both in a rapidly internationalizing Japan and increasingly globalized world.



As relations between Japan and the world deepen, there is increasing demand, in both the corporate world and academia, for individuals who can connect Japan with the rest of the world.

Each year, the School of Japan Studies invites 10 applicants to enter the school as third-year students (第3年次編入学生 Sannenji Hennyugakusei). There are two paths to admission, Type A and Type B. Type A is reserved for 3 applicants from TUFS' partner institutions.(*). whereas Type B is intended for 7 applicants who, regardless of nationality, received a majority of their schooling outside the Japanese education system.

This program opens a new path of study for those seeking to contribute to Japan's internationalization by engaging with local society, contributing to mutual understanding between their country and Japan, and working to strengthen relations between their country and Japan after completing their study and returning home. After gaining admission to the School of Japan Studies, students are required to select a specialized field of study and faculty member to serve as their advisor. During the fourth year, they are required to complete a graduate thesis or equivalent research project.

Eligibility

Applicants must meet or are expected to meet one of the following conditions by September 30, 2024.

- (1) Have obtained a bachelor's degree
- (2) Have graduated from junior college or technical college (equivalent to two or more years of higher education)
- (3) Have attended university under the Japanese education system which extends over four years for two or more years (excluding leave of absence/suspension), and have earned 62 credits or more at university (Note 1) (Note 2)
- (4) Have graduated from a Postsecondary Course at a Specialized Training College which extends over two or more years and meets the criteria specified by Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology JAPAN (MEXT) (limited to those who meet Article 1, Clause 90 of the School Education Act of Japan)
- (5) Have completed at least 14 years of school education outside Japan (including the years inside Japan) <Note 2> <Note 4>
- (6) Have been screened individually for eligibility and approved by TUFS as having the academic ability equivalent or higher than the above and will be aged 20 or older by September 30, 2024
- (Note 1) 62 credits should be earned at the university most recently attended by the applicant and should be credits for their advancement or graduation.
- <Note 2> Applicants must have earned or be expected to earn 62 credits or more from their current university by the time that they enroll at TUFS. If successful applicants fail to earn the required credits, they will lose their admission eligibility.

Those who have completed at least 14 years of school education outside Japan must convert the credits they earned outside Japan and enter them into the calculation sheet (計算シート). The calculation sheet should be submitted together with documentation indicating class content, class hours, and number of classes (a copy of syllabus, etc). This information enables us to determine whether or not the applicant holds the necessary qualifications.

- <Note 3> Foreign nationals must possess or be able to obtain a visa to study in Japan according to the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act (Cabinet Order No. 319 of 1951).
- (Note 4) For applicants who have completed 11 years of secondary education in a MEXT-designated country, the requirement of "14 years of school education" shall be replaced by a requirement of "13 years of school education."
- (Note 5) Individuals covered by requirement (6) are those who do not meet any of the conditions detailed in requirements (1) to (5). If you wish to check your eligibility for requirement (6), contact the Global Admissions Office before applying. Please refer to the following instructions.

- B) Document stating the applicant has academic ability equivalent or higher than those who have completed 14 years of formal school education
- C) Document detailing the applicant's academic history (e.g. academic transcript)
- D) If the applicant has work experience and/or possesses professional license(s), documents listing all of such experience and licenses and their details
- 3. Applicants will be notified of the results via email.



Qualifications

In addition to the eligibility requirements listed on pages $3\sim4$, students must meet all of the following conditions.

- 1. All applicants must meet one of the following requirements:
 - Applicants must meet or be expected to meet the conditions required of individuals educated at universities or schools outside Japan.
 - All applicants must have attended less than four years of primary and secondary education in Japanese schools.
- 2. Applicants must hold and submit an official score at JLPT N2 level or above. *Applicants whose first language is Japanese are exempt.
- 3. Applicants must hold and submit an official English test score at CEFR B2 level or above. The results must include listening, speaking, reading and writing scores.
 - *Applicants who submit TOEIC test scores must submit both of scores of TOEIC L&R and TOEIC S&W.
 - *Applicants whose first language is English and/or who have received their university/school education in English for more than 2 years are exempt.

Screening

The screening process is divided into two steps. First, a review of all applications materials is conducted. Then, an interview is conducted in English and Japanese.






