Japanese Pre-Intermediate 1

Course Content

Japanese Pre-Intermediate 1 is for those who have completed the elementary level course. The goal is to improve Japanese language skills beyond the elementary level, mainly through conversation practice. Course students will use a textbook to study words, grammar, and conversational expressions. By the end of the course, students will be able to ask for directions and explain the customs and practices in their own country in Japanese.

Pre-Intermediate 1 is for those who have completed the elementary level of study, and designed for those who are able to:

- Understand and conjugate verbs into Te-form, Nai-form and Ta-form.
- Conjugate verbs into Plain-form.
- Talk about a list of things you do after you wake up in the morning.
- Compare your country and Japan.

These are some of the content which you will learn in Pre-Intermediate 1.

- Talk about rules of your country.
- Describe food and dishes from your country.
- Talk about what kind of person you want to be in future.
- Talk about your future plan.


